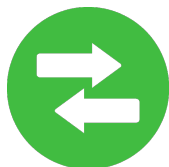

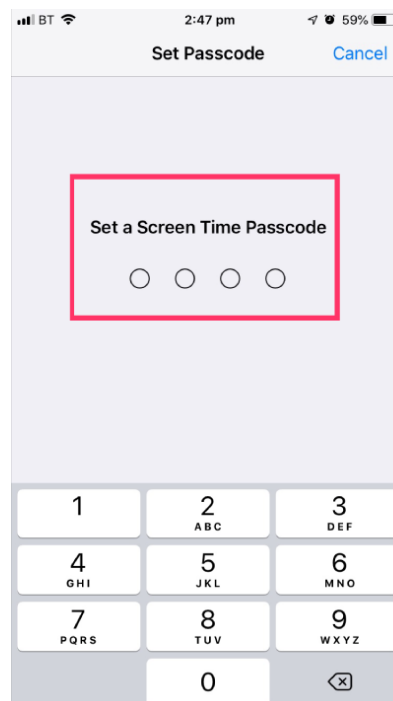
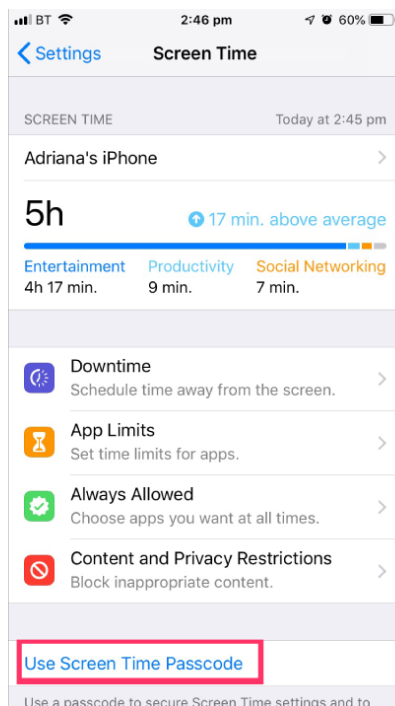
Using Screen Time to set content privacy restrictions and manage in-app purchases Go to Settings and tap Screen Time.



# Apple iPhone and iPad parental control guide



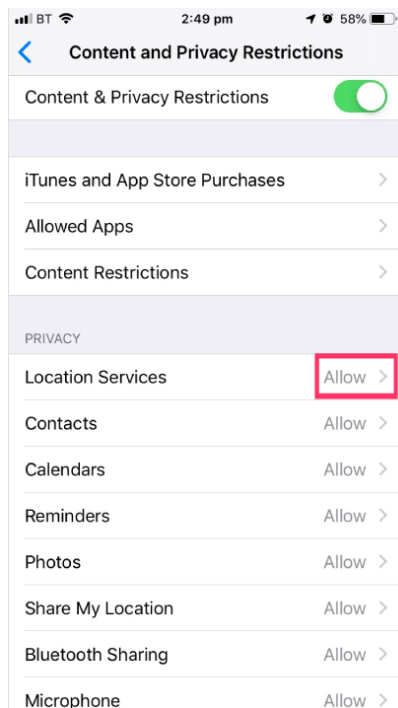
Tap Continue, then choose “This is My [Device]” or “This is My Child’s [Device].” If it’s a shared device and you’d like to ensure settings are not changed then tap Use Screen Time Passcode. Then re-enter the passcode to confirm. If it’s a child’s device, you can follow prompts until you get to Parent Passcode and enter a passcode. Re-enter to confirm.

Tap Content & Privacy Restrictions. If asked, enter your passcode, then you can turn on Content & Privacy. Once you have set up your code, in this section, you can manage in-app purchase, access to apps and automatically filter website content to limit access to adult content in Safari and apps on your device.



# Apple iPhone and iPad parental control guide



Managing in-app purchases in Screen Time Tap iTunes & App Store Purchases. Choose a setting and set to Don't Allow. Please note you can also change your password settings for additional purchases from the iTunes & App Store or Book Store. Follow steps 1-3, then choose Always Require or Don't Require.
