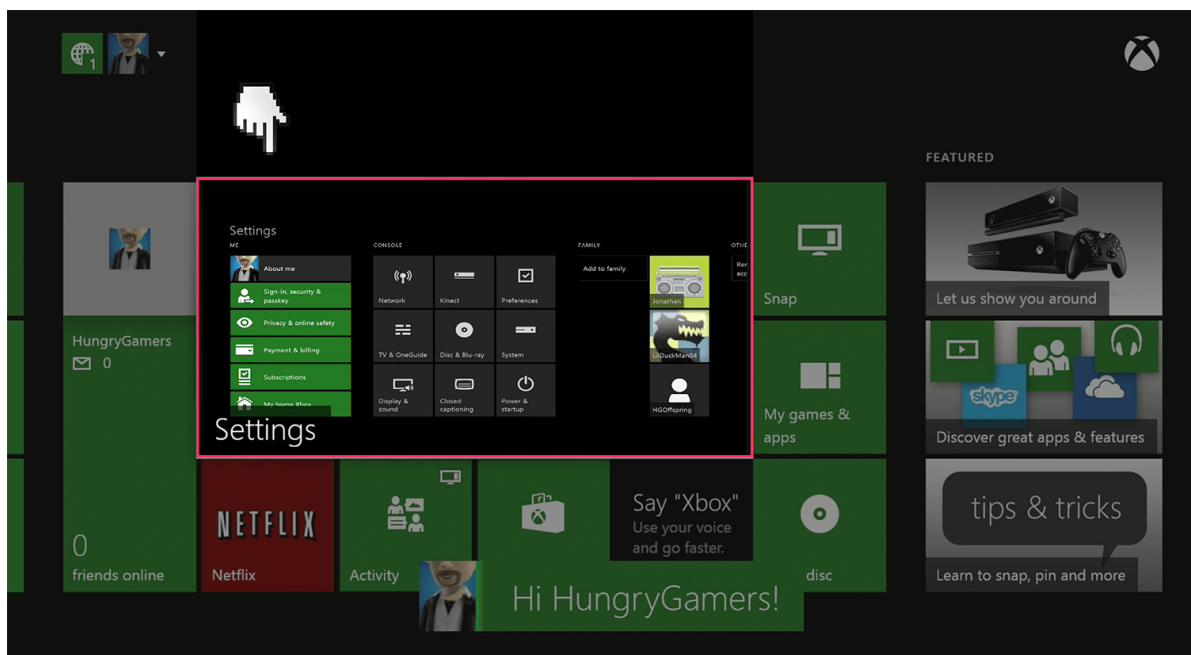

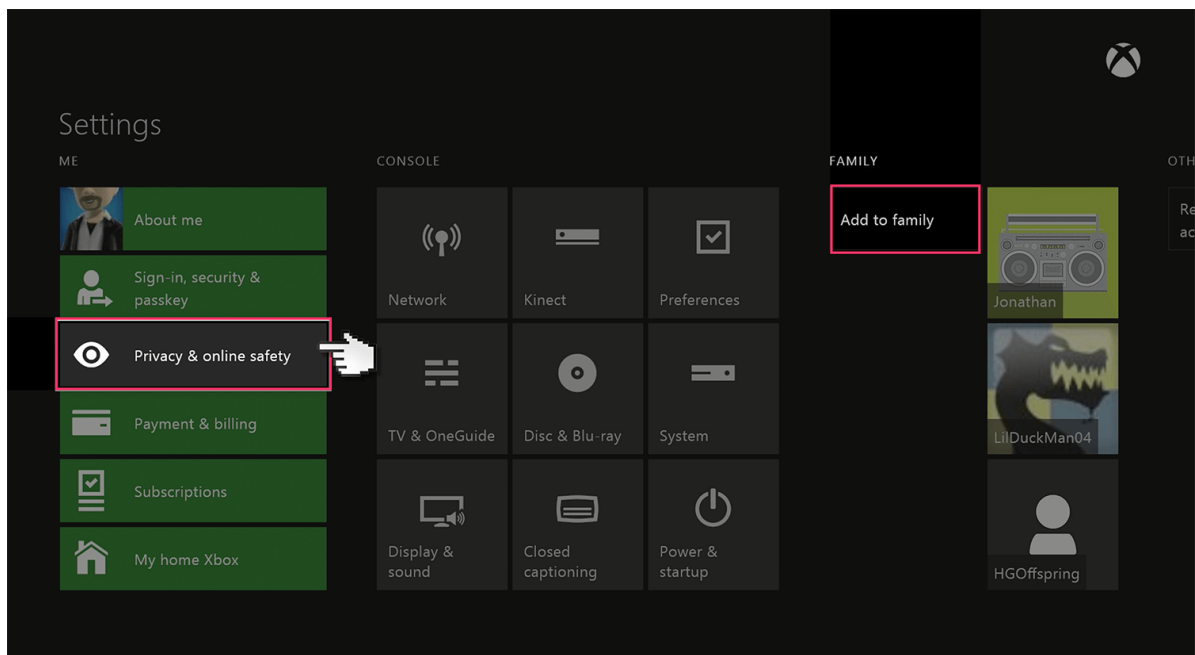
When on the Xbox one dashboard select 'Settings'.

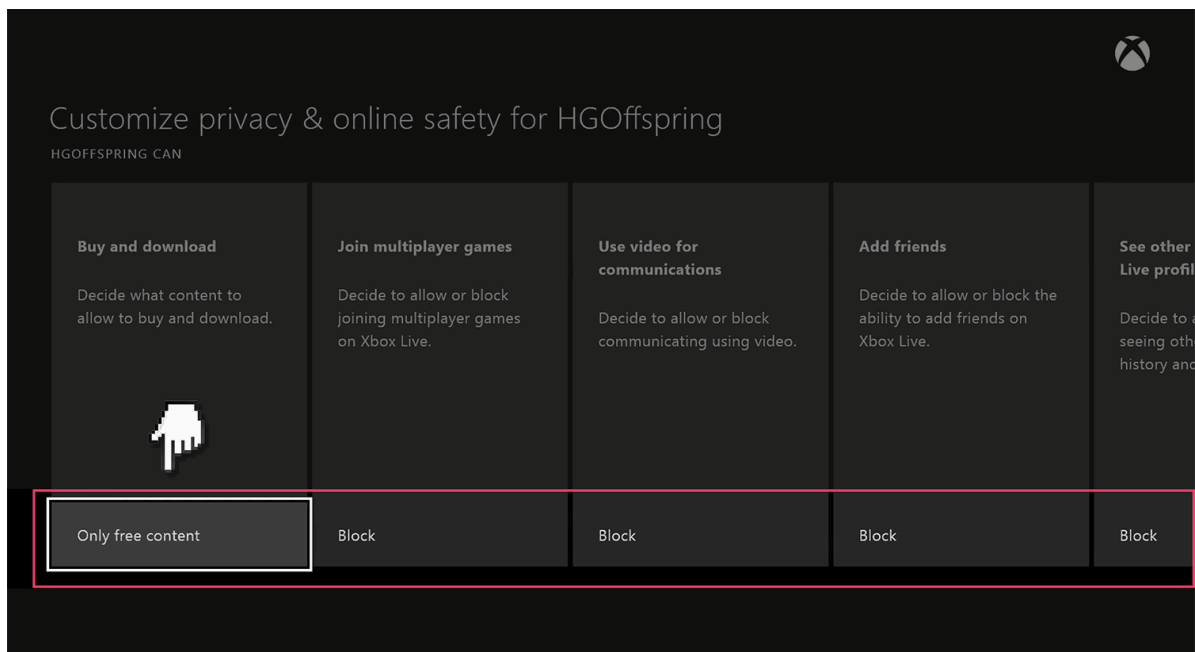

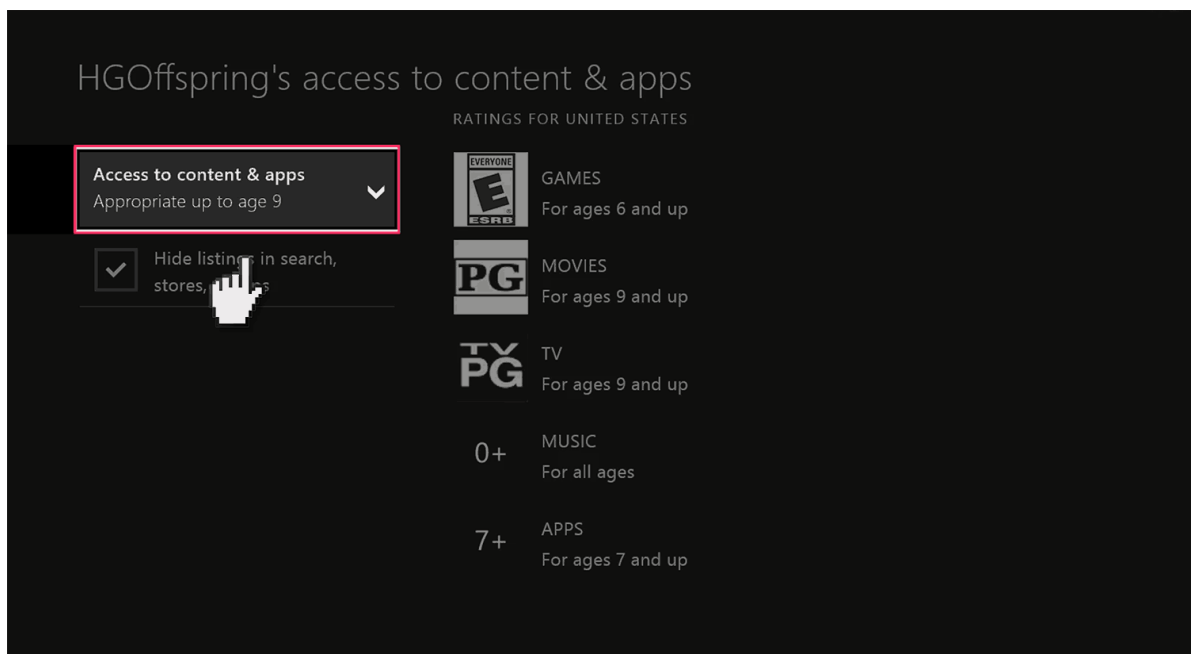
